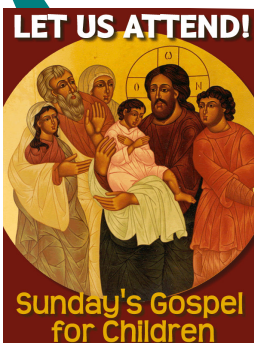
A week later Jesus came to visit them again and told Thomas to touch His wounds. Thomas did. He said, "My Lord, and my God."

5. Jesus is with us always. Remember this especially when you receive Holy Communion.



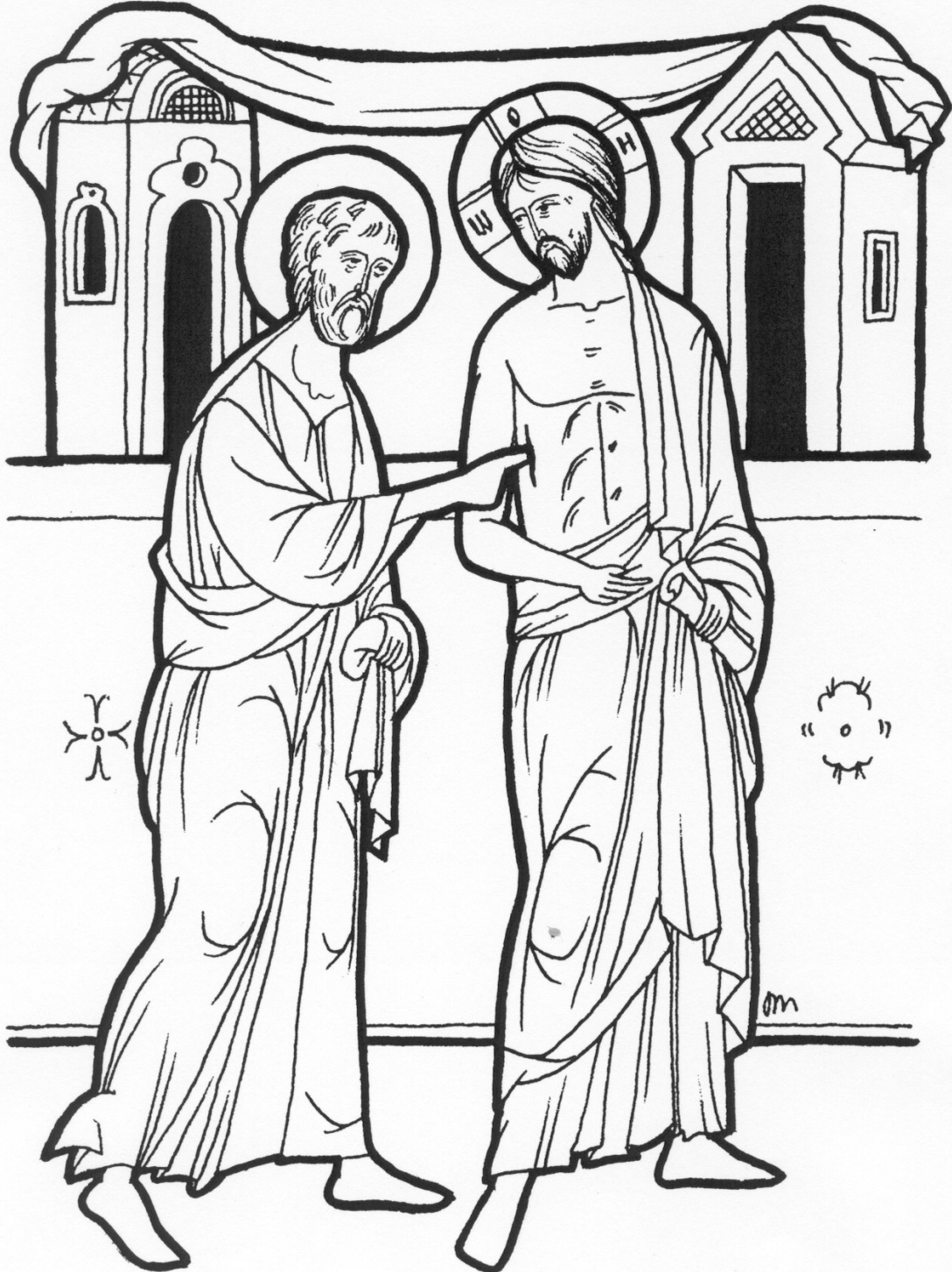

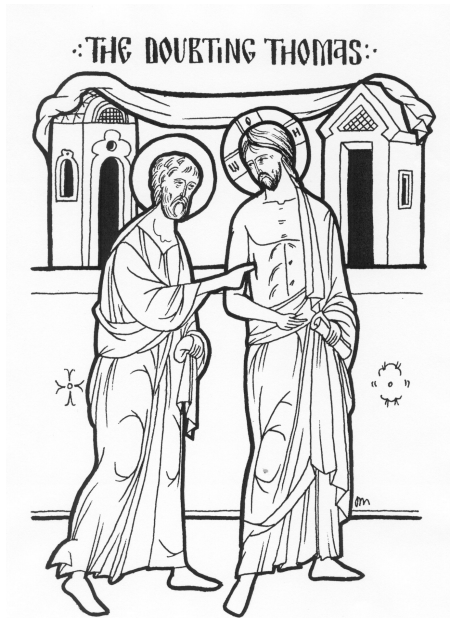

# Thomas Wants To Know for Sure



## One Sunday evening,

Jesus' disciples were together in a room. They closed the doors because they were afraid of the Jews.

Suddenly, Jesus was there with them. He said, "Peace be to you!" and showed them the nail holes in His hands and the spear hole in His side.

The disciples were so happy to see the Lord Jesus! He told them that He was going to send them out to help others learn about God. Then, He breathed on them and told them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." It was a very special time for the disciples.

One disciple, Thomas, was not in the room when Jesus came. Later, when the others told Thomas what he had missed, he said, "I will not believe unless I can see—and even touch—the nail and spear marks for myself!"

Eight days later, the disciples were together in the closed room again. This time, Thomas was with them. Jesus came to them again and again said, "Peace be to you!" Then He went to Thomas and said, "Look,

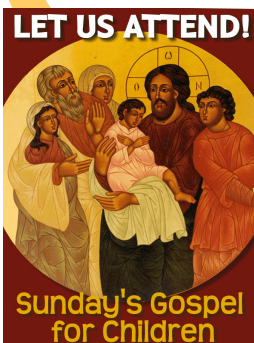

6. The Gospel says that the things that were written down about Jesus were written so we would believe that Jesus is the Christ, and that we may have life in His Name. Do you ever struggle with believing? Take time to read and be strengthened by the stories and words of Jesus in the Gospels.

6. How does Thomas respond when he touches Jesus?
7. What do we sing after we take communion? What is the true light we have seen, and tasted, at communion?
8. How is our reaction after communion like the apostles' reaction after seeing Jesus?
9. Do you think we need to touch or taste things in order to see them? Why or why not?

6. Why do you think we do physical things, like cross ourselves, get sprinkled with holy water, or take communion, as part of our faith?
7. Do you think this helps us believe? Why or why not?
