Jesus answered, "Why did you look for Me? Didn't you know that I must do my Father's work?" But they did not understand what He was saying.

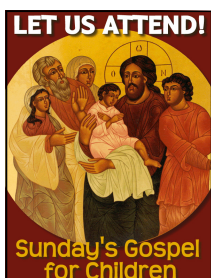

Jesus answered, "Why did you look for Me? Didn't you know that I must do my Father's work?" But they did not understand what He was saying.

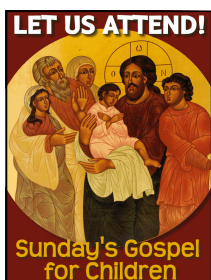
