

THE TOMB IS EMPTY!

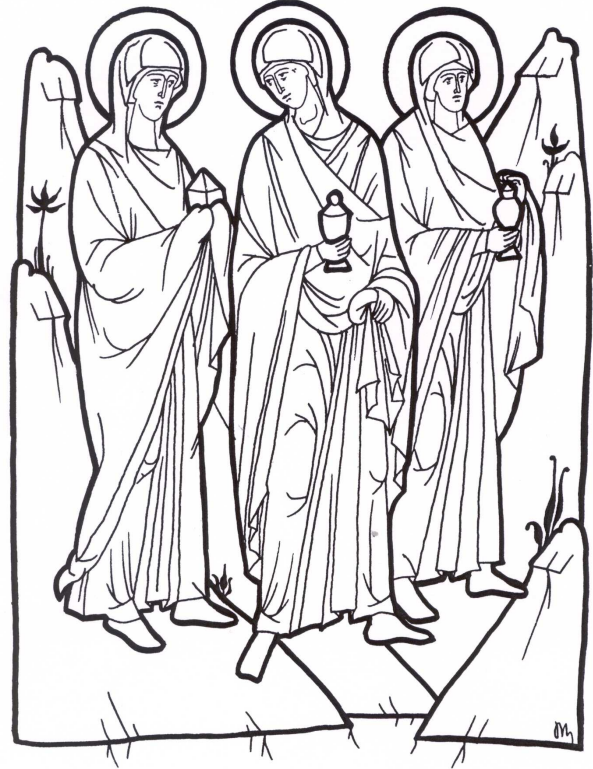

Later, Mary Magdalene and two other women came to the tomb with spices to anoint the body of Jesus. They came as the sun was rising. They wondered how they would get in the tomb, since the big rock was very heavy to move. When they got to the tomb, they said, "Look, the rock is gone, we can go in!"

Inside, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe. They were amazed. He said, "Don't be amazed. You want to see Jesus who was crucified. He is not here. He has risen! Go and tell his disciples and Peter to meet him in Galilee."

They fled from the tomb, they were shaking, and so amazed. They didn't say anything to anyone, because they were afraid.

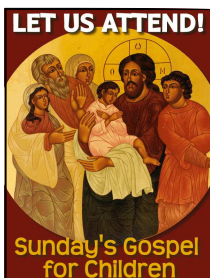

THE WOMEN CAME TO THE TOMB

After our Lord Jesus Christ died, a brave man named Joseph went to Pilate to ask for Jesus' body. When Pilate was sure that Jesus was dead, he said Joseph could have the body.

Joseph wrapped Jesus' body with a linen cloth and laid it in a tomb. The tomb was carved out of rock. A big stone was rolled against the door of the tomb.

The next day was the Sabbath, the Jewish day of rest. On the day after the Sabbath, Mary Mag'dalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices to put on Jesus' body. Very early in the morning, as the sun was coming up, they walked to the tomb to put the spices on Jesus' body. All the way, they talked about how they were going to get the stone away from the tomb so they could get inside.

When the women got to the tomb, there was a big surprise waiting for them—the big stone was rolled away from the tomb's door! When they stepped inside, there was another surprise. Quickly, the women ran out of there. They were shaking and amazed! They couldn't even speak, because they were so surprised. Jesus had come back to life again!

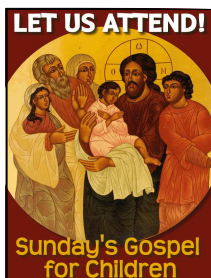
