

The blind man answered, "Lord, I want to see!" Jesus said, "Receive your sight. Because you believed in Me, you are well."


Right away, the man could see! He followed Jesus, praising God. All the people who saw it also praised God!



Man: Lord, let me receive my sight.





7. How might Jesus respond to your prayer?



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
