2. Do you think this is a request or a command?
3. Can you walk up to a dead person and command them to get up?
4. In the Old Testament, who can command action? Who tells people to do things and they go do it?
5. What does Jesus making this command tell us about him?
6. In the Old Testament, who saves the Israelites from death in the wilderness or raises them out of death in the red sea?
7. What does Jesus raising this man from the dead tell us about Jesus?
8. Why do you think the gospel writer is taking the time to write about Jesus raising this young man from the dead? What point is the church making about Jesus by having us read this gospel?
